three months out no oil

Tuesday Nov 23rd 1847
all these 24 hours light winds from
the SE heading to the S saw
Hump Barks Lat 34.34 S Long 00.10 W
O God I pray thee to send us some
oil and wilt thou take care of my
Wife & child keep them from harm
thou hast been kind to us for many
years still keep us and may we meet
again

Thursday Nov 25th 1847
all these 24 hours light wind from
the NE steering SE

Lat 36.01 S Long 4.00 E

Saturday Nov 27th 1847
all these 24 hours light breezes from
the NE and clear steering SE
saw fin Barks in abundance
78 days out

Lat 36.19 S Long 8.00 E

Sunday Nov 29th 1847
first light breeze from the N and hazy
steering SE latter wind WSW and
clear saw a ship steering to the SE
Lat 36.55 S Long 14.00 E Dist 14.00

Wednesday Dec 1st 1847
begins with a strong gale from the
WSW steering SE took in the main
sail latter more moderate made sail
Lat 37.32 S Long 19.55 E

begins with fresh gales from the N
latter still stronger gales from the
W steering SE Lat 37.48 Long 24.50 E

Saturday Dec 4th 1847
all these 24 hours fresh gales from

sea on Lat 37.27 S Long 28.50

Sunday Dec 5th 1847
all these 24 hours fresh breezes from
the NW and clear steering SE
latter part run over the place
marked on the chart for Barks
hook saw nothing

Tuesday Dec 7th 1847
all these 24 hours fresh breezes from
the NE and hazy steering SE
split the gill took it in and repaired
it latter part passed over one of the
places given in Herburgs for the
Dutch shoal at day light the water was
very green appeared like a Bank continued
so for about 10 miles then in the Lat 38.40
Long 38.30 E got at noon 38.46 S Long 39.10 E

Wednesday Dec 8th 1847
all these 24 hours haffling wind from
NW to NE and some rain steering
SE Lat 38.52 S Long 42.50

begins with light wind from the NE
the water looked green sounded 90 fathoms
no bottom saw black fish
