NW by W all sail Lat 16 10 Long by Dist 41 43 W
by Chro 41 35 W

Friday November 1st 1850

All this day light trader steering
NW by W all sail Lat 17 05 Long 43 15 W

Saturday Nov 2^d 1850

All this day gentle trader and some squally
saw gulf weed Lat 18 02 N Long 44 50 W

Sunday Nov 3^d 1850

All this day gentle trader and clear
wind NNE Lat 18 56 N Long 46 58 W

Monday Nov 4th 1850

All this day gentle trader saw 14 sails
steering to the W spoke English Bark
Paris 28 days from London Jamaica
Lat 19 52 Long 48 40 W

All this day light trader on I saw
steering NW by W saw nothing
Lat 21 01 N Long 50 10 W

Wednesday Nov 6th 1850

All this day light wind from NW
spoke the English Brig Confidence
24 days from Liverpool for St Domingo
Lat 21 47 N Long 51 40 W

Thursday Nov 7th 1850

All this day huffing wind from the
Northward spoke the Brig Faira from
Halifax for Barbadoes
Lat 22 23 N Long 53 15 W

Friday Nov 8th 1850

All this day light & fresh breezes from
NW & heading NW saw nothing
Lat 23 17 N Long by Dist 54 35 by Chro 54 45 W

Saturday Nov 9th 1850

All this day gentle breezes from NNE to SE
and cloudy steering NW saw an
English Bark steering NW
Lat 24 15 N Long 56 10 W

Sunday Nov 10th 1850

All this day gentle breezes from
the S latter squally steering
NW saw one sail this a hard
passage Lat 25 40 N Long 58 00 W

30 days from the Equator 45 from
St Helena 88 from Mauritius
