Wednesday May. 28th /57

5. Begins with light breezes from the S.W. steering
S. under easy sail. Middle part the same latter part
strong breezes from the N. the watch employed on
ships duty. two sail in sight so ends. at 12 took in
top gallt sail. strong S.W. current. Lat. 38. 54. N
Long 66. 00. W

Thursday May. the 29th

Begins with strong breezes from N.W. steering S.W.
at 2 P.M. double reefed the top sail, at 4 set up
the main rigging. Main top mast & top gallt stays &
back stays, two sail in sight steering different courses
latter part strong breezes from the S.W. the watch
employed on ships duty so ends. Lat. 38. 21. N
Long 66. 20. W

Friday May. the 30th

7. Begins with strong breezes from N.W. steering
S.W. under easy sail. Middle & latter part
light breezes & calm employed on heaving the cutting
pendants. two sail in sight one boiling, so ends.
Lat. 38. 09. N
Long 66. 18. W

Saturday May. the 31st

8. Begins with light airs & variable. employed on
ships duty. at 2 P.M. saw black fish. lowered
the hook got nothing, too late. Middle & latter
part strong breezes from the S.W. double reefed
the top sail. smothering weather so ends.

Sunday June the 1st 1857

9. Begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. steering
S.W. under double reefed top sail. Jib & bowsprit
Middle & part variable took in the jib. Main sail &
fore reefed the top sail, latter part strong breezes
from the N.W. with rain, set the jib & main sail
No Ob. this day

Monday June the 2nd /57

10. Begins with strong breezes from N.W. with
rain steering S.W. at 5 wind N took in the jib &
Main sail. Middle part strong gales from the
S.W. with took in the fore top sail & fore reefed the
Main at 2 P.M. took in the fore sail & set the fore
spruce brought the ship to the wind heading
S.W. at 2 hard gale & heavy squalls with rain
took in the main top sail at 12. More moderate
wind N.W.

Tuesday June the 3rd /57

11. Begins with strong gales from N.W. set a fore reefed
Main top sail & fore sail steering S.W. at 5 saw a brig
to the S.W. heading N.W. at 7 saw a large ship steering
to the Eastward. Middle part lay by under storm
sail. latter part moderate kept off S.W. & made sail

Wednesday June the 4th /57

12. Begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. steering
S.W. saw 2 sail. Middle & latter part the same
the watch employed on ships duty. so ends with
the breeze in sea a finer & agreeable day
