Thursday, June the 5<sup>th</sup>/51

13. Begins with moderate breezes from WNW steering S by E, under easy sail. Middle & latter part fresh breezes the watch employed in ship's duty clearing the try-pole & at 11 passed the whaling schooner Palmyra of Nantucket steering S, so ends.

Friday June the 6<sup>th</sup>/51

14. Begins with fresh breezes from WNW steering S by E, under easy sail. Middle part strong breezes & squally shortened sail, latter part variable & raining saw fin backs & porpoises so ends. No obs.

Saturday June the 7<sup>th</sup>/51

15. Begins with moderate breezes & cloudy, from WNW set the jib & main sail, steering S by E. Middle & latter part cloudy with showers of rain saw fin backs & porpoises so ends. No obs. this day

Sunday, June the 8<sup>th</sup>/51

16. Begins with fresh breezes from WNW steering S by E, under easy sail, with showers of rain. Middle & latter part the same, saw a bird steering to the Westward.

Monday, June the 9<sup>th</sup>/51

17. Begins with fresh breezes from the NW cloudy & showery steering S under easy sail. Middle & latter part the same saw one sub the watch employed in ship's duty.

Tuesday, June the 10<sup>th</sup>/51

18. Begins with moderate breezes from the S by E steering S by E, under easy sail. Middle & latter part fresh breezes steering S by E, cloudy weather, the watch employed in ship's duty.

Wednesday, the 11<sup>th</sup> June 51

19. Begins with strong breezes from the S by E & heavy steering S by E, at 2 P.M. saw the land, Island of Flores bearing S. Dist 20 miles luffed to the wind heading S by E. Middle part, close reefed top sail ~~with the top sail~~ latter part more moderate wind WNW, compass variable one sail in sight, the watch employed in painting the bark, saw 8 birds so ends.

Thursday, June the 12<sup>th</sup>/51

20. Begins with moderate breezes from WNW steering S by E under short sail. Saw sail in sight at 3 P.M. saw the Island of Pico, bearing S, at 4 P.M. spoke the bark Parker bark of Provincetown, 12 months out 3000 lbs. of spermaceti, middle part, heading to the Westward, latter part light air & calm. Paged & Pico in sight the watch employed in ship's duty, so ends, with fin backs plenty.

Friday, June the 13<sup>th</sup>/51

21. Begins with light breezes from the NW steering S by E the P bark in sight at sun set shortened sail. Middle part the same, latter part light breezes from WNW made sail heading S. Pico in sight to the S by E saw fin backs.
