Sunday August the 5th 1851

72. Begins with light breeze from the S.W. steering S.W. at 6 P.M. spoke the *Sybilston* of Nantucket Capt. Loring, then latter part fresh breeze from S.W. steering S.W. & sail in sight. Lat. 38. 04 N Long. 29. 55 W

Monday August the 6th 1851

73. Begins with fresh breeze from the S.W. heading S.W. Middle part under short sail latter part light breeze & calm, the watch employed in cooping up the Pies in sight & one sail. Lat. 38. 44 N Long. 29. 30 W



Tuesday August the 7th 1851

74. Begins with calm weather finished cooping up the Pies. Middle part under short sail latter part light breeze from the S.W. Made sail steering S.W. Pies in sight & three sails. Lat. 38. 04 N Long. 29. 10 W



Wednesday August the 8th 1851

75. Begins with light breeze from the S.W. steering S.W. for Pies. at 6 P.M. luffed to the wind heading S.W. shortened sail Pies bearing S.W. distance 12 miles Pies & St. George in sight. Middle part by off & on the land. Under short sail at daylight stood on for Pies. but the chains & made sail at 11 came to anchor in 20 fathoms of water.



Thursday August the 9th 1851

76. Lying at anchor three from the Port. Name of Pies at 1 the launch came along side & took 16. Casks of sperm oil & knuckled at on shore. George's 24. H. Gallon at 8 P.M. went on shore with the boat took the men from the

Cruising off the Western Islands August 1851

Left & shipped them before the Comm. three of the boats were deserted. Baker, Loring & Hugh Hemmick, sent the Pies after them. General ships lying off & on

Friday August the 10th 1851

77. Lying at anchor one boat on shore hand nothing favorable of the deserters, the Pies gave up the search.

Saturday August the 11th 1851

78. Lying at anchor one boat on shore shipped three Portuguese & went on board at 6 took the in bar & went to sea strong breeze from N.W. stored the anchors Middle part heading S.W. under short sail latter part more moderate made sail, boufer variable 7 sails & plenty of land in sight. Lat. 38. 22 N Long. 24. 42 W



Sunday August the 12th 1851

79. Begins with light breeze from N.W. heading S. Pies & St. George in sight. Middle & latter part light breeze & variable. Seven sails in sight. Lat. 38. 44 N



Monday August the 13th 1851

80. Begins with light breeze & variable Pies St. George & George in sight & 7 sails. Spoke the Ship Barclay of N.B. 15 months 600. bbls sperm. Middle part equally latter part moderate breeze from the N.W. Made sail steering S.W. Lat. 38. 56 N Long. 28. 55 W



Tuesday August the 14th 1851

81. Begins with light breeze from the S.W. steering S.W. Middle part boufer variable under short sail latter part made sail steering S.W. Eighteen sails in sight. Pies St. George & Lucas. Lat. 38. 04 N Long. 29. 50 W
