Sunday, November the 30<sup>th</sup> 1857.  
109. Begins with moderate breezes from N.W. steering S.W. & set 1st gullt sail, at 4. Put the Row Boat on the beam, middle & latter part light breezes & variable steering S. saw five birds.  
Lat. 33. 08. N.  
Long. 116. 12. E.

Changed the fore sail & jib

Monday, December the 1<sup>st</sup> 1858.  
110. Begins with light breeze from the N. steering S. Middle & latter part moderate breeze, all hands employed in repairing the fore sail & jib, & changing the same, so ends.  
Lat. by Chron. 36. 45. N.  
Long by Chron. 108. 10. E.

Set three watches.

Tuesday, Dec. the 2<sup>d</sup> 1858.  
Begins with moderate breeze from the N.W. steering S. & all hands employed in repairing the old fore top sail & sending up the fore & main Royal Masts and up the main Royal yard & changed fore top sail, Middle part short sail set three watches latter part fresh breeze from N.W. steering S. Under easy sail, the watch employed in repairing the main top gullt sail, so ends.  
Lat. 36. 01. N.  
Long. 111. 55. E.

Ran new look, fells to the mast & low boat.

Wednesday, Dec. the 3<sup>d</sup> 1858.  
Begins with fresh breeze from N.W. steering S. Changed main top gullt sail, saw five birds. Middle part wind S.W. heading S.E. under short sail. latter part moderate breeze from the N.W. Made sail, steering S. so ends.  
Lat. by Chron. 35. 48. N.  
Long. by Chron. 112. 40. E.

Cruising off Cape Lewis, New Holland, December, 1857.

Thursday, December the 6<sup>th</sup> 1858.  
Begins with moderate breeze from N.W. steering S. by N. Middle part southerly variable, latter part steering S. under short sail, strong breeze from N.W. at 10. took in the fore top sail & close reefed the main, heading S. by the wind, at 11. took in the fore sail, at 12. took in the main top sail & set the spruce so ends.  
Lat. 25. 12. S.  
Long. 114. 00. E.

Friday, Dec. the 5<sup>th</sup> 1858.  
Begins with strong gale from N.W. heading S. under storm sails with a heavy sea. Middle part hard gale, turned up the bow boat, latter part hard squalls of hail, rain & wind, at 10 wind S.W. veered ship to the N.W. at 11. more moderate set the main top sail, at 12. Men set the fore sail, so ends.  
Lat. 25. 22. S.  
Long. 114. 30. E.

Saturday, Dec. the 6<sup>th</sup> 1858.  
Begins with strong breeze from the N.W. heading N.W. under short sail, at 2. set the fore top sail. Middle part the same, latter part light breezes & smoky. Made sail steering N.W. pointed on of the fore boat, so ends.  
Lat. 34. 09. S.  
Long. 114. 10. E.

Low One Sail

Sunday, Dec. the 7<sup>th</sup> 1858.  
Begins with light breeze from the N.W. southerly variable smoky weather, at 7. took in sail heading N.W. at 12. veered ship to the S.E. latter part moderate breeze from N.W. & foggy. Made sail, heading S. One ship in sight steering N.W. so ends.  
Lat. 34. 53. S.  
Long. 115. 00. E.
