 weather at 6 P.M. saw the land steering from N.W. to N.E. Dist
 20. Miles at sunset short sail. heading S.W. off shore wind
 S.W. latter part strong breeze from S.W. Made sail heading N.E. with
 fog squalls at 8. saw the land at 11. backed to the S. double reefed
 the top sail. Lat. 35. 15. S Long. 117. 15. E
