Saturday, March, the 6th 1852

Begins with Moderate breezes from S.W. heading S.
Middle part under short sail, latter part light breeze from
S.W. Made sail & tacked to the S. as ends. Lat. 28. 50. N
Long. 109. 50. W.

Sailed from the N.

Sunday, March, the 7th 1852

Begins with light breezes from S.W. heading S.
Middle part under short sail, latter part fresh breeze from
S.W. Made sail heading S. at 11. double reefed the
top sails, so with a N. swell.

Lat. 28. 50. N
Long. 110. 00. W.

Monday, March, the 8th 1852

Begins with strong breezes from S.W. steering S.W.
sent down the Main Royal Yard, & fore royal Mast. Middle
part strong gales & variable under short sail, heading to the N.
Southeast wind from S.W. to S.W. latter part fresh breeze
from the N.W. Made sail, steering S.W. Lat. 30. 05. N
Long. 110. 40. W.

Tuesday, March, the 9th 1852

Begins with light breezes from the N. steering S.W.
Middle part light breezes & variable heading S. latter part light
breezes from the S. heading S. at 11. made employed in
sending down the fore top Mast, & setting new bungs trees
at 11. sent up the Mast, so ends. Lat. 30. 20. N
Long. 110. 00. W.

Wednesday, March, the 10th 1852

Begins with light breezes from the S.W. heading S.W.
employed in setting up the fore top Mast rigging, & sending up
the fore top galli Mast. Middle part heading N. latter part
Moderate breezes from the S. southerly, variable, sent up the Main
Royal Yard, fore Royal Mast, & sent the fly jib. Lat. 30. 20. N
Long. 110. 30. W.

Cruiser off New Holland, March, 1852

Thursday, March, the 11th 1852

Begins with fresh breezes from the S. steering N.
Middle part heading S.W. under short sail, latter part Moderate breeze
from S.W. Made sail, steering N.W. the watch employed in repairing
the main top galli. sail, saw one fin back, one English Merchant
ship, exchanged signals, with the same our Greenpeace. More than
we have seen for the last - Four weeks. Lat. 30. 30. N
Long. 109. 10. E.

Saw one Seal.

Friday, March, the 12th 1852

Begins with light breezes from S.W. steering N.W. Middle
part heading S.W. under short sail, latter part Made sail, steering
N.W. Moderate breezes. Lat. 30. 05. N
Long. 108. 00. E.

Spoke the Iris.

Saturday, March, the 13th 1852

Begins with Moderate breezes from S.W. steering N. Middle
part under short sail, latter part strong breezes, southerly variable
Made sail, at 9. Spoke the Ship, Iris, 22. Months, Capt.
100. bbls sperm oil, 300. bbls whale, Lat. 29. 30. N
Long. 108. 00. E.

Sunday, March, the 14th 1852

Begins with strong breezes from S.W. heading S.
Middle part under short sail, latter part Made sail, heading
S.W. the Iris in sight, so ends. Lat. 29. 20. N
Long. 108. 10. E.

Monday, March, the 15th 1852

Begins with strong breezes from the S. heading S.W.
Middle part under short sail, latter part blue reefed top sail
& fore sail, so ends.

Lat. 28. 30. N
Long. 109. 15. E.

Saw one seal.
