Monday, April the 5th 1852

Begins with light breeze from the N. heading to the eastward
Employed in boiling. Middle & latter part moderate breeze & variable heading to the S.W. finished boiling. One sail in sight.

Spoke the young Phoenix

Tuesday, April the 6th 1852

Begins with moderate breeze from the S.W. cloudy. heading N.W. at 2. tacked to the S.W. two sail in sight at sunset
Spoke the young Phoenix Middle part moderate breeze & variable. latter part fresh breeze from S.W. & cloudy heading S.W.

Wednesday, April the 7th 1852

Begins with fresh breeze from the S.W. & rainy steering N.W. under short sail. Middle & latter part light breeze & variable southerly. much the same. saw hills, & few birds. the Phoenix in sight.

Thursday, April the 8th 1852

Begins with light breeze from the S. heading S.W. Middle & latter part light breeze from S.W. with light showers of rain. all hands employed in stowing oil, down the main hatch at 5. finished so. heading S.W.

Friday, April the 9th 1852

Begins with light breeze from S.W. heading S.W. all hands employed in stowing water. Middle & latter part fresh breeze from the S.W. heading S.W. under short sail. the cooper employed in repairing water buckets.

Cruising off New Holland, April. 1852.

Saturday, April the 10th 1852

Begins with fresh breeze from S.W. heading S.W. the watch employed in ship duty. the cooper, repairing backs. Middle part under short sail latter part strong breeze & cloudy, steering N.W. under short sail. saw one sail.

Lat. 26. 34. N.

Long. 109. 25. W.

Saw one sail.

Sunday, April the 11th 1852

Begins with strong breeze from S.W. steering N. under short sail. Middle part heading S.W. latter part more moderate. made sail steering N. Cloudy weather.

Long. 109. 40. W.

Monday, April the 12th 1852

Begins with moderate breeze from the S.W. & cloudy. heading S.W. Middle part heading S.W. under short sail. latter part moderate breeze & variable. made sail heading to the eastward. No Obs. the cooper repairing water buckets.

Lat. 25. 30. N.

Long. 109. 20. W.

Tuesday, April the 13th 1852

Begins with light breeze from the S.W. & cloudy. heading N.W. Middle part under short sail. latter part light breeze from the S.W. made sail heading S.W. Cloudy weather.

Lat. 25. 45. N.

Long. 108. 40. W.

Saw one sail.

Wednesday, April the 14th 1852

Begins with light breeze from S.W. & cloudy. heading S.W. on sail in sight. the cooper employed in repairing water buckets. Middle part moderate breeze from the S.W. heading S.W. latter part strong breeze from the S.W. with fog. Sails variable so ends.
