Begins with strong gale from the S.W. heading S.W. under close reefed main top & fore sail. Middle part the same. better part more moderate. Made sail heading S.W. wind S.W.

Thursday, April the 29th 1852

Begins with fresh breeze from S.W. heading S.W. under short sail. Middle part the same. better part more moderate. turned ship to the S.W. & made sail. pointed the Starboard Boat. Cut side & Bow Boat in side. saw fin back.

Begins with moderate breeze from the S.W. & cloudy. Heading S.W. Middle part light breeze & variable. under short sail. better part light breeze from S.W. Made sail heading S.W. at 11. saw sperm whale, a going S.W. to the windward.

Monday May the 3rd 1852

Begins with moderate breeze from the S.W. at 1. lowered the three boats. for the above mentioned whale. at sun set. came on board. without success. & took in sail heading S.W. Middle part under short sail. better part fresh breeze. Made sail. at 10. looked to the S.W. so back.

Tuesday, May the 4th 1852

Begins with fresh breeze from the S.W. heading S.W. at 2. saw sperm whale, a going quick to the windward, lowered the boats. in chase. at sun set. came on board. with out success. & took in sail heading S.W. by S. better part strong gale heading S.W. under short sail so back.
