 Begins with strong breeze from the S. heading S.W. under close reefed top sail & fore sail. Middle part took in the fore top sail & fore sail, latter part more moderate made sail, heading S.W. by S. wind from the eastward, saw fin back, the watch employed in repairing the fore sail, so ends.

Tuesday, June the 22nd
 Begins with fresh breeze from S.W. heading S. under double reefed top sail, courses full & sprun, fine had the fore sail. Middle part under short sail, latter part squally from the N.W. with heavy showers of rain, steering S.W. by S. under short sail.
 Lat. 25. 40. S
 Long. 108. 10. E

Wednesday, June the 23rd
 Begins with moderate breeze from the S. & rising steering S.W. by S. under short sail. Middle part squally, latter part strong breeze from the S. made sail steering S.W. by S. so ends.
 Lat. 25. 02. S
 Long. 108. 40. E

Repaired the old fore sail.

Thursday, June the 24th
 Begins with strong breeze from S.W. heading S. under double reefed top sail & courses full & sprun, at sunset shortened sail. Middle part wind variable, latter part light air & calm. Employed in repairing the old fore sail, saw fin back.
 Lat. 26. 04. S
 Long. 109. 00. E

The crew shows white at daylight, Long. 109. 00. E

Friday, June the 25th
 Begins with light air & variable, with shower of rain. Middle part strong gale from the S.W. with hard squalls of wind & rain took in the main top sail, latter part steering S. set a close reefed main top sail. White water again.
 Lat. 26. 23. S
 Long. 109. 45. E

Saturday, June the 26th
 Begins with strong gale from the S.W. steering S. under a close reefed main top sail & fore. Sprun, Middle part more moderate wind S.W. heading S. latter part made sail, steering S.W. finished & bent the fore sail, saw fin back & black fish.
 Lat. 25. 55. S
 Long. 109. 40. E

Sunday, June the 27th
 Begins with moderate breeze from S.W. steering S.W. at sunset saw sperm whale, going S.W. too late to lower the boats, Middle part steering S.W. latter part light breeze & variable. Made sail, saw fin back at 11. saw sperm whale going quickly to the N.W.
 Cloudy, weather S.W.
 Lat. by alt. 25. 10. S
 Long. by alt. 109. 20. E



Monday, June the 28th
 Begins with light air & calm, at 1. lowered the boats for the above mentioned whale. The whale going quickly could not get to the S.W. but sight of the whale came along side & took up the boats, without success as usual. Middle part under short sail, light breeze & variable, latter part fresh breeze from the S.W. made sail steering S.W. by S. saw fin back, the watch employed in ship's duty, setting up rigging etc.
 Lat. 23. 31. S
 Long. 110. 00. E

 Begins with fresh breeze from the S.W. steering S.W. by S. Middle part light breeze & calm, latter part moderate breeze from S.W. & rising. Made sail, steering S.W. by S.
