Wednesday, June the 30th 1852
Begins with strong breeze from the S. squally & rainy.
At 1. shortened sail, steering S. Middle part variable, latter
part strong gale from the S. steering S. W. under short sail,
Lat. 24. 02 S.
Long 109. 40 E.

Thursday, July the 1st 1852.
Begins with strong breeze from the S. steering N. by E. under
short sail. Middle part Moderate breeze from
S. S. E. heading S. under short sail, latter part made sail, steering
N. by E. The watch employed in clearing the fore top
sail, saw fin backs, so ends.
Lat. 24. 40 S.
Long 108. 40 E.

New-hunted, the fore top sail
Friday, July the 2^d 1852
Begins with light breeze from the S. heading S. S. E.
Middle part the same, latter part, light breeze from S. S. E. made
sail, steering S. S. E. cloudy weather finished the fore top sail
At 1. Lat. 24. 00 S.
Long 108. 20 E.

Saturday, July the 3^d 1852
Begins with light breeze from the S. S. E. through variable
cloudy weather. Middle part the same, latter part
light breeze from S. S. E. made sail, heading S. the
watch employed in repairing the fore topmast in
bottom canvas, saw fin backs. Lat. 24. 48 S.
Long 108. 20 E.

Sunday, July the 4th 1852
Begins with light breeze from S. S. E. heading S.
At 1. sun set & shortened sail. Heading N. E. latter part light
breeze from the Westward & cloudy. Made sail steering S.
with light fog squalls. At 8. Lat. 24. 35 S.
so ends the Fourth of July. Long 109. 00 E.

Cruising off New Holland, July 1852.

Monday, July the 5th 1852
Begins with light breeze from the Westward, & cloudy. At 1. 2. 3.
steering S. the celebrator the Fourth on the Fifth, the year
At 1. belonging to the Drac, on shore, but in hopes of the next,
Middle part heading S. S. E. under short sail wind S. latter part
Moderate breeze from the S. E. made sail heading S. S. E. finished
the job, saw fin backs.
Lat. 24. 30 S.
Long 110. 00 E.

Second West current,
Tuesday, July the 6th 1852
Begins with light breeze from the S. heading S. S. E.
repaired & bent the fore top mast, stay sail, saw fin backs.
Middle part heading S. S. E. under short sail, latter part light breeze
& variable, with fog squalls, made sail heading to the Eastward.
Current setting to the S. W. so ends. Lat. 24. 22 S.
Long 110. 10 E.

Repaired the main top gall sail,
Wednesday, July the 7th 1852
Begins with light breeze from S. S. E. heading S. the
watch employed in repairing the main top gall sail
saw fin backs. Middle & latter part calm, finished & bent the
main top gall sail. & repaired the speaker, so ends.
Lat. 24. 22 S.
Long 110. 10 E.
Long by Dist. 109. 27 E.

Thursday, July the 8th 1852
Begins with light breeze from the W. steering S. finished
the speaker. Middle & latter part light breeze & variable saw
fin backs. Lat. 24. 15 S.
Fitted New, main top mast, back stays, Long 110. 32 E.

Friday, July the 9th 1852
Begins with light breeze from the S. steering S.
fin backs plenty. Middle & latter part light breeze & variable
heading different & cloudy the watch employed in setting up
& tacking the back stays. Lat. 24. 14 S.
Long 110. 50 E.
