 Begins with light breeze & variable, from the Westward, steering S. for back's plantation. Middle light air, latter part light breeze & calm. The watch employed in breaking out the fore Peak for old water, pipe Shooks, so on. Lett. 24. 08. 4.
 Long. 111. 16. 0

Sunday, July the 11th 1852
 Begins with light air & calm, heading to the Eastward, saw fin back, Middle & latter part the same course, variable.
 Lett. 29. 51. 4.

Monday, July the 12th 1852
 Begins with calm weather, Middle part light air & variable. Under short sail, latter part moderate breeze from the S.W. Made sail steering S. by E. The watch employed in setting up, old pipe shooks, for water saw fin back so on.
 Lett. by 6h 23. 49. 4.
 Long by 6h 112. 30. 6

Tuesday, July the 13th 1852
 Begins with moderate breeze from the S. heading S.W. Middle part under short sail, latter part made sail, fresh breeze & cloudy, heading S.W. & S. by E. No Cal. Lett. by 6h 26. 00. 4.
 In sight. Long by 6h 113. 20. 6

Wednesday, July the 14th 1852
 Begins with fresh breeze from the S.W. & cloudy, heading S.W. Middle part - boursa, variable, latter part strong breeze from S.W. & cloudy, made sail steering S.W. at 8. At 11. saw the land Cape Guinea, bearing, S. Dist. 15 miles. Height of S.W. by 6h. Supposed the chronometer to be 50 miles to the Eastward, at 12, double reefed the top sail. Lett. by 6h 23. 40. 4.
 No Cal. Long by 6h 113. 20. 6

Cruising off the West Coast of New Holland, July. 1852.

Wednesday, July the 15th 1852
 Begins with strong breeze from S.W. & cloudy, steering S.W. by N. under double reefed top sail & boursa, at 4. P.M. saw the land, bearing S.W. by E. Dist. 12 miles. Height of S.W. took in the fore & main sail, latter part - blue weather made sail, steering S.W. so on.

Supposed the true Longitude, 113. 15. 0

 Long. by 6h 113. 20. 6

Friday, July the 16th 1852
 Begins with fresh breeze from S.W. steering S. Middle part S.W. under short sail, latter part strong breeze from the S. heading S.W. all hands employed in breaking out between decks, coopers heads & stowing pipes for water, so on. Lett. 19. 45. 4.
 Long 113. 23. 6

Saturday, July the 17th 1852
 Begins with strong breeze from the S. heading S.W. at 4, finished stowing pipes, at sun set strong gale, took in the fore & main top sails, & fore mid. & set the spencer Middle part - hard gale, latter part the wind changed suddenly from S.W. to S.E. blowing a hard gale, with heavy rain, heading S.W. at 12. began to moderate so on. No Cal.
 Lett. by 6h 20. 30. 4.
 Long. 113. 20. 0

Sunday, July the 18th 1852
 Begins with strong gale from the S. heading S.W. at 4. moved ship to the S.W. & set a close reefed main top sail, at 4. More moderate set the fore sail, wind S. kept up. S.W. Middle part strong breeze from the S.W. steering S.W. set a close reefed fore top sail, latter part - made sail steering S.W. & blue weather.
 Lett. by 6h 19. 02. 4.
 Long by 6h 114. 15. 6
