

Bark Dray of New Bedford. Bound for Sapporo, Simos Straits,

Monday, July the 17th 1852

Begins with strong breezes from the S.W. steering S.W. at sun set double reefed the top sails Middle part the same at day light

Made sail so ends, the watch employed in starting water

Left by Ob. 11. 57.9

Long by Ob. 11. 25. 6

Tuesday, July the 20th 1852

Begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. steering S.W. Middle part N.E. latter part strong breezes from S.W. & cloudy steering S.W. by S.

No Ob. Left by Ob. 10. 10. 6

Long by Ob. 11. 20. 6

Set two watches.

Wednesday, July the 21st 1852

Begins with strong breezes from S.W. & cloudy steering N.E. by S. at 1. took in the main top Gallt-sail & fly jib. Middle part double reefed the top sails latter turned out the reef set two watches, so ends.

Left by Ob. 11. 32. 9

Long by Ob. 12. 05. 6

Changed, fore top sails.

Thursday, July the 22nd 1852

Begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. steering S.W. by S. at 1. took in the main top Gallt-sail & fly jib & Gallt-top sail. Middle part steering N.E. Moderate breezes latter part light breezes steering N.E. by S. changed fore top sails, abandoned the fore top.

Friday, July the 23rd 1852

Begins with light breezes from the S.W. steering S.W. Middle the same at 1. part 1. saw the Island of Kaituma bearing from N.W. to N.E. Dist 20 miles. kept of N. so ends.

July 1852 Bark Dray of New Bedford, In the Straits of Simos

Saturday July the 24th 1852

Begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. steering for the land. at 4. P.M. under the Island of Pulo Dion bearing S.W. dist 6 miles heading N.E. by S. along the land. sent the shrimps, & got one anchor of the house entrance of Simos Straits. Middle part strong breezes & squally double reefed the top sails heading from S.W. by N. to S.W. latter moderate made sail heading N.E. by S. at day light saw the land Simos bearing S.W. dist 15 miles so ends. the land anchor of the house & was heeled a range of 20 fathoms on both shrimps took in the waist boat & put out the old boat.

Sunday, July the 25th 1852

Begins with light air & calm at sunset Simos bearing S.W. dist 15 miles at 6. strong breezes from S.W. heading S. double reefed the top sails at 7. tacked to the N.E. latter working up Sapporo Bay strong breezes at 1. bore to anchor off Sapporo in 13 fathoms of water. one shutt Bark at anchorage so ends.

Monday August the 2nd 1852

Begins with light breezes from the S.W. at daylight took the anchor and started out for Simos Straits. Discharged Robie Isaac left Harry Thomas on shore under the Doctor & took one man from the shore. Paid Robie Isaac forty eight dollars & fifty cents for his part of 120 barrels of sperm oil at one dollar per gallon at the 15th by.

Tuesday August the 3rd 1852

Begins with light air & calm. Sapporo vanille Middle part light breezes from the S.W. steering N.W. at daylight saw Pulo Dion bearing S.W. dist 15 miles took the anchor on the house the watch employed in turning Rigging at 9. saw Simos bearing N. dist 20 miles so ends. In the Straits of Simos
