Thursday, Nov. the 11<sup>th</sup> / 52

Begins with light breezes from the N.E. heading N.E. by E. finished hoisting C.B. Middle part short sail. Latter part all hands. Employed in stowing of C.B. one sail in sight.

Friday, Nov. the 12<sup>th</sup> / 52

Begins with fresh breezes from the N.E. heading S.E. by E. finished stowing C.B. Spoke the Bark Wave of New Bedford, Capt. Down, 16 Months, 300. lbs. of iron Got one man from the wave. Name Asa. Crawford 400 lbs. of C.B. including 15. with 4 home. at the time of his coming on board of the Draco. Latter part heading N.W. so ends.

Saturday, Nov. the 13<sup>th</sup> / 52

Begins with strong breezes from the N.E. steering S. Middle part heading S.E. under short sail. Latter part cloudy. Made sail. Breeze variable. saw fin backs.

Sunday, Nov. the 14<sup>th</sup> / 52

Begins with fresh breezes from the N. & squally with showers of rain. heading S.E. by E. under short sail Middle part variable & raining. Latter part strong breezes & cloudy. heading N.W. so ends.

Monday, Nov. the 15<sup>th</sup> / 52

Begins with strong breeze from the S.E. cloudy heading N.W. under short sail. Middle part heading S. latter part light breezes from the S.E. tacked to the N.W. & made sail. Employed in repairing the Old duck boat.

Lat. 22. 40. S Long. 49. 16. E

Cruising off Madagascar. November. 1852.

Tuesday, Nov. the 16<sup>th</sup> / 52

Begins with light breezes from the S.E. heading S.W. by W. Middle part short sail latter part. Moderate breeze from S.E. & heavy made sail steering S.W. saw fin backs.

Long. 48. 55. E

Wednesday, Nov. the 17<sup>th</sup> / 52

Begins with fresh breezes from S.E. & heavy saw breeches. Breeze variable. Middle part heading S.E. under short sail. Latter part fresh breezes from S.E. Made sail steering S.W. saw fin backs & killed.

Lat. 24. 28. S

Long. 48. 25. E

Saw the Wave.

Thursday, Nov. the 18<sup>th</sup> / 52

Begins with fresh breezes from S.E. Breeze variable. Middle part heading S.E. under short sail. Latter part strong breezes from the N.E. made sail steering S.W. the Bark Wave in sight. at 11. saw breeches. run for the shore.

Long. 47. 50. E

South by current

Friday, Nov. the 19<sup>th</sup> / 52

Begins with strong breezes from the N.E. running for the above mentioned breeches. at 2. saw the Wave. boats down the whole started quick to the windward. did not lower the boats. It being unclear, two sail by night. Middle part heading S.E. latter part N.W. cloudy stormy weather. spoke the Wave. saw porpoises.

Saturday, Nov. the 20<sup>th</sup> / 52

Begins with strong breeze from the N.E. with higher showers of rain. heading S.W. under short sail. at 6. moved to the S.E. of sun set took in the fore top sail. Middle part raining. latter part from moderate wind. Made sail & tacked to the N.W. heavy weather one sail in sight.
