Thursday Oct. the 27th 1859

Begins with fresh breeze from the N. heading S.W. W. hailing at 4 finished hailing. Middle part Moderate steering S.E. under short sail. latter part light breeze employed in coopersing bid. so onds. Lat. 35. 07. N. Long. 111. 10. W.

Friday Oct. 28th 1859

Begins with light breeze from the N. steering S.E. by E. Middle part the same. latter part from the S.W. heading N.W. W. all hands employed in stowing bid. saw fir backs. so onds. Lat. 35. 07. N. Long. 111. 18. W. Fir backs.

Saturday Oct. the 29th 1859

Begins with light breeze from the S.W. heading N.W. W. finished stowing bid. at 7. Reared ship to the S. Middle part the same. latter part the watch employed in clearing up the decks. washing ship. steering S.E. saw fir backs. Lat. 34. 54. N. Long. 112. 20. W. Fir backs.

Sunday Oct. the 30th 1859

Begins with light breeze from the N. steering S.E. cloudy weather. Middle part the same. latter part light air & variable, so onds. Lat. 35. 16. N. Long. 113. 08. W.

Monday Oct. the 31st 1859

Begins with light air & variable Middle part Moderate from the S.E. heading S.W. W. latter part strong breeze saw fir backs. so onds. Lat. by obs. 34. 47. N. Long. by obs. 114. 16. W.

Cruising off Cape Lewis. November, 1859

Tuesday November the 1st 1859

Begins with strong gale from the S.E. heading S.W. W. at 1. Close reefed the top sail & furled the jib & main sail. Middle & latter part heading S.W. W. thick smoky weather. saw fir backs. Lat. by obs. 34. 58. N. Long. by acct. 114. 00. W.

Wednesday Nov. the 2^d 1859

Begins with strong gale from the S.E. heading S.W. W. under a close reefed main top sail & fore sail. thick smoky weather. latter part took in the fore sail heading S.W. W. rigged in the top jib boom. No 6. Lat. by acct. 34. 53. N. Long. by acct. 113. 30. W. Took in the flying jib boom.

Thursday Nov. the 3^d 1859

Begins with strong gale from S.E. heading S.W. W. under a close reefed main top sail & spinnaker. Middle & latter part the same. Lat. by obs. 34. 58. N. Long. by obs. 113. 10. W. Saw one sail

Friday Nov. the 4th 1859

Begins with strong gale from S.E. heading S.W. W. under a close reefed main top sail & spinnaker. latter part Moderate from the S.W. made sail, steering S.E. W. saw fir backs. & one sail. so onds. Lat. by obs. 35. 07. N. Long. by obs. 113. 40. W.

Saturday Nov. the 5th 1859

Begins with fresh breeze from the N. steering S.E. Middle part heading S. under short sail. latter part squally from the S.W. made sail. heading N.W. W. so onds. Lat. by obs. 35. 07. N. Long. by obs. 113. 45. W.
