

Ship in the South Atlantic Ocean

Tuesday Nov. 19-1892

This day I am misty weather light southerly wind, ship on the wind heading from S.W. to S.E. four sails in sight all heading to the North, emp. doing odd jobs on board, mid. part light air and calm latter part calm with some fog repaired the main top sail and sent it one sail in sight.

Long = 25-59 W)

Wednesday Nov. 20-1892

This day I am hazy light southerly wind, ship close hauled on the wind to the S.E. emp. doing necessary work on board, nothing in sight, mid. part light air and calm latter part calm emp. doing ordinary ships duty on board nothing in sight.

(Lat 30-00 S
Long 25-52 W)

Thursday Nov. 21-1892

This day I am calm weather emp. doing necessary work on board nothing in sight, mid. part calm latter part fine weather light breeze from the East, emp. getting out water nothing in sight ship working South.

(Lat 30-12 S
Long 25-57 W)

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Friday Nov. 22-1892

This day I am fine weather light breeze from the East, ship heading to the South, emp. doing necessary work on board nothing in sight, mid. part strong East wind, steering South, latter part fine weather strong breeze from the East, ship steering S.W. of East emp. doing ordinary ships duty one sail in sight.

Long 25-25 W)

Saturday Nov. 23-1892

This day I am cloudy strong breeze from E to N.E. steering S.W. of E, emp. doing odd jobs on board nothing in sight, mid. part strong breeze latter part fine weather with moderate breeze from the N.E. steering S.W. of East, emp. doing nothing in sight (but fine backs nothing on board).

(Lat 34-35 S
Long 24-22 W)

Sunday Nov. 24-1892

This day I am fine weather strong breeze from N to N.E. steering S.W. of E, emp. doing nothing in sight (but fine backs nothing on board), mid. part fog ship lying a back from time to time light East part strong breeze from the North, thick fog saw a large blue whale close to the ship, looked three boats but did not see them after boats came the whale going to the N and fog could not keep him of him.
