

Ship cruising in the C.A. Ocean

Sunday Dec. 1. 1822

This day from thick weather
Spring & Earth and ship working
to the East with all present
sail out nothing in sight but fin
backs and light and light
from N.E. Latter Part
light and from N.E. to N.W.
thick fog during ships duty
on board No. 205

Monday Dec. 2. 1822

This day from light and from
N.E. to West and thick fog
steering E. & S.E. nothing in
sight but fin backs & sun
down took in light sails
steering E. & S. Half S (mist)
Ship heading to the East &
in latter part fine weather light
breeze from the North & ship
steering to the East & employed
during evening ships duty nothing
in sight but fin backs

(Lat. 35=27 S
Long. 23=28 W)

Tuesday Dec. 3. 1822

This day from fine weather light
and from the N. steering E. &
nothing in sight during whole
day on board at sun down
shortened sail and came to on
the western back, and at
thick weather latter part strong
breeze from N.E. and thick
fog ship on the E. back

(Lat. 35=32 S
Long. 22=48 W)

Ship in the South Atlantic Ocean

Wednesday Dec. 4. 1822

This day from strong breeze ship
under full sail and on the
E. back thick fog during ships
duty on board and at about
the same Lat. Part Hazy with
some rain made all sail kept
off steering S. & E. & nothing in
sight but fin backs (Lat 35=45 S
Long 21=34 W)

Thursday Dec. 5. 1822

This day from moderate weather
and from the N. & ship heading
S. & E. & S. E. nothing in
sight but fin backs & fin backs
the Royal Star parted up with a
new one at sun down shortened
sail came to on the E. back
and at about the same latter
part Hazy strong breeze from N. &
much sail steering E. & S. E. &
nothing in sight but fin backs
employed ships duty on board

(Lat. 35=10 S
Long. 20=50 W)

Friday Dec. 6. 1822

This day from Hazy weather
strong breeze Reeper down came
to on the E. back heading to
South & nothing in sight at
sun down closed Reeper the top
sails and took in the fore sail
and at about the same latter
part fine weather strong breeze from
the West & made all present sail
and kept off to the N.E. toward
three boats for black fish but
did not strike and backing out
water

(Lat. 35=08 S
Long. 20=28 W)
