This day very strong breeze from
the west & squally rose
the Isle there hauled up
steering N. East. by compass
nothing in sight, latter part
fine weather moderate S. W.
wind ship heading to the
S. W. E nothing in sight
(Lat 35-20.8
Long 11-07.1)

Thursday Jan. 26. 1879
This day very fine weather &
light & westerly wind steering
from E to S. W. E nothing
in sight (mid and latter
part strong westerly wind and
squally ship steering for
whales emp doing ordinary
ships duty on board nothing
in sight, (Lat 35-45.8
Long 10-02.8)

Ship in the South Atlantic Ocean

Monday Jan. 27. 1879
This day very fine weather strong
westerly wind ship steering for
whales nothing in sight employed
doing ordinary ships duty on board
latter part fine weather moderate
breeze from S. W. ship steering to the
East. Employed Brackins but water
nothing in sight (Lat 33-55.8
Long 9-15.8)

Tuesday Jan. 28. 1879
This day very fine weather light
breeze & wind ship steering to the
East & employed doing ordinary
ships duty on board nothing in
sight at sun down shortened sail
(mid part calm latter part fine weather
strong westerly wind ship working
to the N. E employed preparing
the fore top sail nothing in
sight, (Lat 33-40.8
Long 8-28.8)

Wednesday Jan. 29. 1879
This day very fine weather strong
westerly wind ship working to the
N. E East finished the fore sail
and bent it nothing in sight
at sun down shortened sail
latter part fine weather strong
westerly wind ship in the track
nothing in sight employed doing
odd jobs on board (Lat 33-45.8
Long 7-32.8)
