This day Calm Hazy weather
light airs Ship on the
western tack nothing in
sight but Humpbacks
mil Part about the same
Latter Part light breeze Ship
on the eastern tack employed
Painting the two quarter Boats
nothing in sight (No Obs)

Tuesday Sept. 2. 1878

This day Calm light southerly
winds & Ship on the eastern
tack emp doing ordinary Ship
duties nothing in sight mil
Part about the same Latter Part
light airs & Calm employed
Painting the H & B Boats
nothing in sight (Lat. $5^{\circ} 20' S$
Long. $9^{\circ} 12' E$)

Wednesday Sept. 3. 1878

This day Calm light southerly
winds & toward two Boats
after B fish but did not
strike Boats came on
board employed Painting
the main mast and other
jobs on board, Latter Part
light breeze kept off Steaming
on East with all sail set
employed Rattling down the
main Rig in nothing in
sight (No Obs)

Ship Cruising for Sperm Whales

Thursday Sept. 4. 1878

This day Calm thick haze with
light breeze Steaming on East
employed Rattling down the
main Rig in nothing in
sight, Latter Part moderate
breeze Steaming to the North
employed setting up the
top mast Rig in and Ruler
long down saw H Backs.

(Lat. $5^{\circ} 22' S$
Long. $9^{\circ} 31' E$)

Friday Sept. 5. 1878

This day Calm light winds
Ship Steaming to the North
emp doing necessary work on
board one sail in sight
at seven AM came to on the
tack Latter Part light breeze
the Sun Beam in sight of
Bark Mars Capt went on board
the Sun Beam emp Rattling
down the fore Rig in (Lat. $4^{\circ} 45' S$
Long. 9°)

Saturday Sept. 6. 1878

This day light breeze Steaming
with the Sun Beam the
Bark Mars & the Brig in
sight employed Rattling down
nothing in sight, mil Part
about the same Latter Part
light breeze Ship on the East
tack the Bark Sun Beam
and the Brig employed Rattling
down the fore Rig in (Lat. $4^{\circ} 38' S$
Long. $9^{\circ} 10' E$)
