

Ship off the Isle of St. Helena

Saturday Nov 15, 1829

This day more moderate ship steering toward the Isle spoke and saw the Bark Mars & Sarah B. Hale Mars taken go from since leaving Calcutta. Latter part ship ran up the harbor Capt went on shore the B. K. Mars Sarah B. Hale & the Mary & Annie of the Isle

Sunday Nov 16, 1829

This day ship off on on the Isle the Bark came on board, stood off shore with the ship & sail in Larry. Latter part light grades ship crossing off the Isle several sails in sight

Monday Nov 17, 1829

This day fine weather light breeze ship crossing off the Isle Capt on shore several sails in sight. Mid part light breeze. Latter part fine weather at nine P.M. sent a boat on shore after the Capt four boats off the harbor

Ship off the Isle of St. Helena

Tuesday Nov 18, 1829

This day fine weather on boat ashore after the Capt came off at three P.M. made all sail and steering S. by compass Mid part moderate breeze. Latter part about the same ship heading N. by line with all sail set two sails in sight.

(Lat. 19 = 55.8  
Long. 7 = 08.8)

Wednesday Nov 19, 1829

This day fine weather moderate breeze. Mid part ship steering S. by compass doing odd jobs on board two sails in sight. Mid part strong breeze steering N. half S. by compass. Latter part moderate breeze ship steering N. half South employed starting water and other jobs nothing in sight so early this day

(Lat 17 = 12.8  
Long 9 = 08.8)

Thursday Nov 20, 1829

This day fine weather moderate breeze steering N. half S. by compass nothing in sight. Mid part strong breeze. Latter part moderate breeze steering N. half S. by compass employed doing ordinary ship's duty on board nothing in sight

(Lat. 18 = 12.8  
Long. 11 = 13.8)
