

Bark & Booming of New

Friday July 3rd 1856
Strong single fair breeze from
E & S at 7 am started for whales
going to the windward got none
Lat 51° 00' S
Long 165° 18' W

Sunday July 6th 1856
fine weather gentle breeze from E & S
heading to the N at 7 am saw sperm
whales at 8 am loaded for whales board
three boats in pursuit of them at 9 am
starboard boat ~~lost~~ went along
side of a large sperm whale the boatsterior
sparked one from at the monster which
caused the monster to kick and
nearly filled the boat with water
and Richard Allen the boatsterior
was seen no more. he belonged to
Albion New York age 22 years
their boats.

he also hit the off boat
in tow. picked up the boatsterior
and returned on board with the loss
of one man. And boat Lat 41° 00' S
Long 169° 03' W

South Pacific Ocean

Monday July 8th 1856
fine weather boat in pursuit of
whales very wild got none Lat 41° 10' S
Long 168° 42' W

of New Bedford Boats Mast

Saturday August 16th 1856
saw sperm whales loaded got one to S
starboard boat lost his line
Lat 00° 30' S
Long 179° 17' W

Thursday August 21st 1856
strong breeze saw sperm whales loaded struck
to starboard boat lost whale and line
went off spouting blood

Saturday September 13th 1856
fine weather saw whales going quick to the
windward

Wednesday October 22nd 1856
fine weather ship Harman of Nantucket
and Bark & Bowden of Dartmouth
at 7 am saw sperm whales loaded for them
in company with said ships got one
half of a whale
Lat 2° 48' S
Long 162° 50' E

Friday November 21st 1856
fine weather at 10 am saw sperm whales
loaded struck to off boat got captured by
four line but succeeded in getting him
Lat 12° 30' S
Long 164° 33' E
