

Bark E Corning of New

Sunday December 7<sup>th</sup> 1856  
Strong breeze from E & E ship heading to  
the S at 2 p.m. saw sperm whale large  
long whale going quite to the windward  
did not lose the boats Lat 20° 20' S  
Long 161° 23' E

Monday December 24<sup>th</sup> 1856  
fine weather at 5 p.m. looked for sperm  
whales being near night did not get any  
Lat 160° 30' W  
Long 35° 00' S

Tuesday December 25<sup>th</sup> 1856  
fine weather at 6 p.m. saw sperm whales  
but to near night shot one with Cornhorne  
Lat 35° 53' S  
Long 160° 26' E

Wednesday December 26<sup>th</sup> 1856  
fine weather at 2 p.m. looked for sperm  
whales without success Lat 36° 00'  
Long 160 45 E

Thursday January 6<sup>th</sup> 1857  
Strong breeze from N at 2 p.m. saw sperm  
whales in company with the ship  
saw hawks of Nantucket but the going  
is to the E & E
