

Bark Millinocket of Dartmouth 1862

Thursday September 25th 1862

This twenty four hours commenced with fine weather
wind N^W at 11 am sailed from New Bedford for
New York

Friday September 26th 1862

weather continuous fine wind light from N^W at
11 p.m. passed through the narrows latter part calm
wind S.W. at 1 p.m. came to anchor near the light ship on
the middle ground at 4 am weighed anchor again
wind N^W

Saturday September 27th 1862

fine weather wind light from E. at 8 p.m. came
to anchor of Hart Island middle wind N.E. raining
latter part at 4 am got underway again and went
to Raccoon Island and anchored. heat tide at 10
o'clock took pilot and steamed through the gate

Sunday September 28th 1862

weather cloudy wind N.E. at 3 p.m. dropped anchor
in Middle Hollow Channel in 7 fathoms water

Monday Sept 29th

weather fine employed in ship's duty discharged
Steward Sick

Tuesday September 30th

weather fine still laying at anchor shipped another
Steward this day ends with fine weather employed ship's
duty

Wednesday September October 1st 1862

the weather still part a schooner came about
of us but did no damage to speak of latter part
wind E thick and rainy

Thursday September October 2nd 1862

this day continued stormy wind N.E. ends this
twenty four hours
