this twenty four hours still continues storming  
winds S.E. latter part fine winds S.W.

Saturday October 4<sup>th</sup> 1852

this day commences with fine weather winds S.W.  
employed in drying sails latter part weather  
continues fine employed in rigging in forenoon  
this twenty four hours ends with strong breezes from  
S.W. at 5 p.m. took a steam tug and docked  
the ship at Brooklyn

Sunday October 5<sup>th</sup>

weather fine strong breeze from S.W. this twenty  
four hours ends with fine weather lying at  
Whetmore dock Brooklyn

Monday October 6<sup>th</sup> 1852

weather continues fine all sails shrouds to  
day weather continues fine winds S.W.

Tuesday October 7<sup>th</sup> 1852

fine weather winds S.W. this twenty four hours  
ends with very warm weather

Wednesday October 8<sup>th</sup> 1852

weather still continues fine employed in  
setting up rigging this day ends with very warm  
weather

Thursday October 9<sup>th</sup> 1852

fine weather employed in setting up rigging  
ends this day

Friday October 10<sup>th</sup> 1852

this day begins with cloudy weather wind S.E. this twenty four  
hours ends with another Easterly storm

Saturday October 11<sup>th</sup> 1852

this twenty four hours commences with a rain storm  
winds from S.E. this twenty four hours ends with stormy  
weather

Sunday October 12<sup>th</sup> 1852

this day clear weather winds S.W. weather cold this  
twenty four hours with strong S.E. winds

Monday October 13<sup>th</sup> 1852

this twenty four hours commences with a S.E. rain  
storm the storm continues through the day

Tuesday October 14<sup>th</sup> 1852

weather fine winds S. employed in ship's duty

Wednesday October 15<sup>th</sup> 1852

weather continues fine employed in ship's duty  
wind S. this day ends with fine weather

Thursday October 16<sup>th</sup> 1852

fine weather winds S.W. employed in ship's  
duty at 8 a.m. left Brooklyn and proceeded to the Atlantic  
dock

Friday October 17<sup>th</sup> 1852

fine weather winds W. at 2 p.m. commenced taking  
in cargo took in 174 bags of salt. bags in each  
condition.

Saturday October 18<sup>th</sup>

weather fine employed in taking in salt took in  
according to my account 345 bags and one barrel of salt  
a dispute of 3 bags taken from Wheelers Ware house  
Atlantic dock 20 ends

Sunday October 19<sup>th</sup> 1852

weather fine winds W. all hands to church
