Wednesday December 3rd 1862
weather fine wind N E took on board 55 barrels
of rosin latter part a N E storm

Thursday December 4

N E storm still continues at 3 am came in
contact with a steamer and carried away flying
jib board wind N weather fine

Friday December 5th 1862

this day fine weather wind from the North this
afternoon took on board forty two barrels of turpentine
Ninety barrels of Turpentine latter part to N E rain
storm

Saturday December 6th 1862

this day strong breeze from south at 4 p.m. before 12 noon
latter part employed in taking in cargo middle part wind
continues strong latter part fine wind N W took up
anchors and moved the ship employed in taking in
cargo

Sunday December 7th 1862

weather fine wind N W this day strong breeze from
N W

Monday December 8th 1862

weather clear and fine wind N W employed in taking
cargo

Tuesday December 9th 1862

weather continues fine wind south employed in taking
on board cargo latter weather fine wind light from
N W employed in taking in cargo

Wednesday December 10th 1862

fine weather light air from S employed in getting
ship ready for sea latter part light air from
the North at 8 am took anchors but could not
get out on account of light air and head tide

Thursday December 11th 1862
weather fine wind south dead ahead waiting
patiently to get out at 11 am weighed anchor from
Beaufort N E wind south light

Friday December 12th 1862

weather fine light air from south at 1 1/2
p.m. discharged pilot middle part light air
from N E hours of E E latter part wind N E
Ship heading E with starboard tack on

Lat at noon 34° 27'

Long at 3 p.m. 36° 15'

Saturday December 13

this day fine weather light air from N E
Ship by the wind heading E E with starboard
tack on board two sail in sight we are now in the
Northern edge of the Gulf Stream middle part calm
latter part wind light from N N E Ship by the
wind heading N W with starboard tack on board

Lat 35° 07' N

Sunday December 14th 1862 Long at 3 p.m. 36° 15'

weather continues fine calm at 3 p.m. latter part
light breeze N by E 11 miles distant
several vessels in sight middle part calm
latter part light air from south Lat 35° 23' N

Long at 3 p.m. 75° 02' W

Monday December 15th 1862

weather fine wind light from south Ship covers
N by E several sail in sight middle and latter
part fine weather light air from south Lat at noon 36° 20' N

Long 75° 14' 22' W

Tuesday December 16th 1862

this day good breeze from south covers S by E wind increasing
middle part strong breeze from south covers N by E
latter part wind shifted to W in a squall ship under
close reef top sails
