

Bark Mallinnet of Dartmouth

Sunday March 29th 1853
weather fine wind from south Cape came
in boats could not get anchor in the
city for new orleans middle and latter
part stormy weather

Monday March 30th 1853
weather cloudy wind from south and
East Middle and latter part wind from
the North kept on shore

Tuesday March 31st 1853
weather fine at 1 p.m. the steamer came
along side we got our anchor but had
some difficulty and broke horse pipe
and barges and heads were sent five
miles in and to Coast this twenty four hours
ends with fine weather employed in hauling
ships

Wednesday March 1st
weather fine employed in setting up rigging
latter part weather continues fine

Thursday March 2nd 1853
weather continues fine employed in
ships duty this twenty four hours ends with
a S.W. wind employed in fitting ships

Friday March 3rd 1853
weather fine wind S.W. latter part wind
from North this day ends with fine weather

Saturday April 4th 1853
weather continues fine employed in ships duty

Sunday April 5th 1853
this twenty four hours fine hauled along
side of the pier

Monday April 6th 1853
fine weather arrived to the North
this day ends with fine weather employed
in ship duty

Tuesday April 7th 1853
weather fine we are now waiting for a freight
they appear to be dull enough nothing remarkable
takes place the remainder part of this day

Wednesday April 8th 1853
weather continues fine nothing done thought
the day so ends

Thursday April 9th 1853
weather fine waiting for a freight this
twenty four hours ends with fine weather at 10
a.m. a party came on board and examined
the ship & bought her

Friday April 10th 1853
weather fine wind S.W. this afternoon discharged
the crew & paid them off
