Schr E. W. Catfield of Provincetown O. F. Keeth

Wednesday May 1st 1867

Fresh breeze and pleasant off and on at ^{the} side of Barbadoes at about 11 o'clock A. M. sent in a boat for letters at 12 Mer the boat returned was visited by a boat from the O. W. Cook of Provincetown at 2 o'clock B. W. kept of N. N. W. all sail set

Thursday 2nd 1867

Light airs from the Eastward and pleasant steering N. W. by N. all sail set saw the Island of Martinique to the S. W. also saw two sails

Friday 3rd 1867

Light baffling airs with some rain steering for the passage between the Islands of Martinique and Dominica saw several sails and plenty of humbirds

Saturday 4th 1867

Light airs and calms lowered and took 2 Blackfish and 3 Porpoises sent in a boat and got a permit to anchor in Prince Rupert's Bay Dominica spoke the Schr Walter Irving of Provincetown Capt. Atkinson saw several other vessels

to

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Sunday May 5th 1867

Light airs and pleasant at daylight of the mouth of Prince Rupert's Bay at noon came to anchor of the Town so end this day

Monday 6th 1867

Light airs and calms took on board two rafts of water and stowed one the schr Walter Irving came to an anchor so ends this day

Tuesday 7th 1867

Calms and rainy attempted to paint in the forenoon but gave it up took of more water and stowed it

Wednesday 8th 1867

Light airs and calms with some rain took of one raft of water and one boat load of wood and stowed it the Starboard watch went on shore at sunset

Thursday 9th 1867

This day employed in getting of and stowing wood finished painting sent on shore 4 gallons of Blackfish oil took on board 14 dozen pine apples four men that went on shore last night have not yet returned
