Thursday June 20th 1867

Light breeze from the Southward and fine pleasant weather by the wind on opposite tack under all sail nothing in sight Lat 35° 50' N

Friday 21st 1867

Light breeze from the Southward and pleasant steering by the wind to the S. E. under all sail Saw a Brig steering to the S. E. and also a Schooner which we sent a boat aboard of she proved to be the Caroline A. Farnsworth of Babeloos 8 days from New York Lat 35° 40' North Long 57° 48' West

Saturday 22nd 1867

Fresh breeze from the Southward and pleasant Saw three sails steering to the S. E. also saw a Pinback Latitude 35° 00' North

Sunday 23rd 1867

Light breeze from the Southward and fine pleasant weather at daylight saw two Barks ahead at about 8 o'clock saw them manuvring made sail and ran for them and spoke them and they reported saw a school of whales going quick to the Eastward also a school of Blackfish all three of us ran off to the N. E. gamming at 10 o'clock broke up the gam and returned on board and steered N. E. the rest of the day No Observation.

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Monday June 24th 1867

Fresh breeze from the Southward and fine pleasant weather steering S. E. by Compass under easy sail Saw three sails Latitude 35° 02' N Longitude 52° 46' West

Tuesday 25th 1867

Fresh breeze from the N. W. and overcast weather with light rain during the latter part of the day steering S. E. under easy sail No Obs.

Friday 26th 1867

First part of this day the wind from the N. W. had increased to a moderate gale with some rain and heavy sea at 2 o'clock A. M. rolled the Ward Boat down and filled her with water as she came up carried away the after Davitt and both of her bearings slightly stove in the boat immediately called all hands and took her in Dubing the Middle and latter parts moderating with quite a heavy sea on and a light drizzling rain on Wind still from the N. W. No Obs.

Thursday 27th 1867

Light breeze from N. E. and rugged steering S. E. under easy sail Engaged in repairing the Waist boat and her gear Lat 34° 14' N.
