Light breeze from the Westward and fine pleasant weather steering E. under all sail, abeam with the Schooner Ellen Woodman of Fairhaven, Lambert Master 3 months out clear Lat $36^{\circ}05'$ N Long $74^{\circ}41'$ West

Wednesday 24th 1867

Light breeze from the Westward and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind on opposite tacks under all sail. Two sails in sight at 4 o'clock P. M. raised buoys and saw spouts, called them Sperm Whales but did not ~~ascertain~~ ascertain for a certainty they being too far off

Thursday 25th 1867

Light breeze from the Westward and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind on opposite tacks under all sail nothing in sight

Latitude $35^{\circ}54'$ North Longitude $75^{\circ}46'$ West

Friday 26th 1867

Strong breeze from the Westward and rugged steering by the wind on opposite tacks under easy sail saw a bark steering to the Eastward Lat $36^{\circ}38'$ N Long $70^{\circ}02'$ W

Saturday 27th 1867

Light breeze from the westward and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the E. W. under all sail several sails in sight three Merchantmen the others Whalers sound the day Latitude $35^{\circ}49'$ N Longitude unknown

Sunday 28th 1867

Light breeze and fine pleasant weather, Laying to under short sail, gained the Bark Cape Horn Barge of Dartmouth and Hadley of New Bedford. No Observation this day

Monday 29th 1867

Light breeze from N. W. and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind on opposite tacks under all sail several sails in sight Latitude $35^{\circ}46'$ N Longitude $76^{\circ}31'$ W

Tuesday 30th 1867

Light breeze from N. E. and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind on opposite tacks under all sail gained with the Bark Cape Horn Barge of Dartmouth and the Minicola of New York another sail in sight Latitude $36^{\circ}22'$ Longitude $76^{\circ}23'$ W
