Wednesday, Sept 4<sup>th</sup> 1867

Strong breeze from the Eastward and rugged by the wind to the S. E. untill 2 o'clock P. M. then wore ship to the N. E. and shortened sail to D. R. 4. grib and main try sail saw three sails two Schooners and a Brig Lat 35.05 North

Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> 1867

Strong breeze from N. E. and rugged steering by the wind to the Northward under short sail saw two sails Latitude 35.22 North

Friday 6<sup>th</sup> 1867

Strong breeze and rugged wind east and squally with some rain sail two Boats to leeward so ends this day Latitude 35.37 North.

Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> 1867

Wind from N. E. and more moderate by the wind on opposite tacks under short sail one sail in sight Lat 36.02 N Long 45.42 W.

Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> 1867

Fresh breeze from E. S. E. with a heavy rolling swell steering by the wind to the Eastward under short sail  
Latitude 35.38 N Longitude 45.37 West

Monday, Sept 9<sup>th</sup> 1867

Bright breeze from S. E. with a heavy rolling swell from South steering by the wind to the Eastward & under short sail nothing in sight Lat 35.44 N Long 46.01 W.

Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> 1867

This day commences with a light breeze from the N. E. with a heavy roarin rolling swell from the Southward with some rain at 10 o'clock A. M. the wind struck from the N. E. in a heavy thunder squall and continued to blow from that quarter gradually from increasing with Bar falling saw a Schooner on the Starboard tack hove to.

Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> 1867

This day commences with a strong Gale from N. E. and increasing with a falling Bar. at daylight this morning found the lanyard to the Bobstay parted put on a preventer at 2 o'clock A. M. the Mast stay parted immediately rigged in the fore boom and sent in the Flying jib put up a preventer Mast stay. at 5 o'clock the wind had increased to a heavy Gale the Barometer standing at 29.28 when it suddenly began to moderate continued about 4 hours then the wind hauled to the Westward and began to blow again harder then before blew about 2 hours then began to moderate with a rising Bar saw a sail to windward
