Monday Oct 21st 1867

Strong wind from the Southward the Starboard watch on Liberty at sunrise this morning the watch returned on board except one who deserted and also brought 2 of the Starboard watch that deserted the day before the Brig Star Castle came to anchor 4.50 Sperm 4 month out

Tuesday 22nd 1867

Fresh breeze from N.E. and pleasant all hands employed in on the head gear finished all and bent the flying jib

Wednesday 23rd 1867

Fine pleasant weather took our Starboard anchor on the bow took on board some sweet potatoes squashes and green corn so ends the day

Thursday 24th 1867

Fine pleasant weather took on board some Irish Potatoes and onions at 1 o'clock P.M. slipped our moorings and towed out into the passage the remainder of the day off and on at the south side of the Island

Friday 25th 1867 Oct

Light airs from N.E. and pleasant off and on at the south side of the Island in company with the S. R. Cooper and Admiral Blake at 2 o'clock P.M. took on Board 4 men at about 10 o'clock collided with the S. R. Cooper carrying away our Starboard shrouds and topmast Backstay both dabbitts beams and cranes to the Starboard Boat and badly shoving the boat and slightly shoving the Stern Boat besides splitting our Mainwail badly and damaging the Monkey rail

Saturday 26th 1867

Light airs and fine pleasant weather steering S. by E. under all possible sail employed in the main rigging knotting and setting up the shrouds

Sunday 27th 1867

Light breeze from N.E. and fine pleasant weather steering S. by E. under all sail.

Monday 28th 1867

Light winds from N.E. and fine pleasant weather steering S. by E. under all sail employed in repairing the Starboard Boat. Lat. 34.35 North
