Friday Nov 8th 1867

Light breeze from the S. W. and fine pleasant weather steering S. Finished repairing the S. Boat gear and put out the Boat employed in the Main Rigging saw one sail a Brig
Lat 24.42' N Long 28.18' W

Saturday 9th 1867

Light breeze from the Eastward and pleasant weather steering South employed in repairing the Mainsail saw one sail steering to the S. W.

Sunday 10th 1867

Fresh breeze from the Eastward and pleasant steering South all sail set on two sails steering to the S. W. Lat 23.25' North

Monday 11th 1867

Fresh breeze and fine pleasant weather steering to the Southward Employed in repairing the Main sail two sails in sight at 11 o'clock raised 3 sperm Whales at one o'clock lowered three Boats Starboard Boat struck staving the Boat the Starboard Boat came up and took the line but had hardly got it when iron drew the started S. W. quickly chased until near sundown then returned on board Lat 22.16' N Long unknown

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Tuesday 12th 1867 Nov

Light breeze from the Eastward and pleasant steering S. W. finished repairing the Mainsail and bent it the rest of the day employed in repairing the Starboard Boat
Lat 20.24' N Long 28.21' W

Wednesday 13th 1867

Light breeze from the Eastward and pleasant steering S. W. under all sail employed in repairing the Starboard Boat nothing in sight
Lat 19.15' North Long 28.48' West.

Thursday 14th 1867

Strong breeze from the Eastward and squally steering S. E. by E under all sail finished repairing the S. Boat and put her on the crane saw a Brig steering to the Southward. Lat 18.25' North

Friday 15th 1867

Strong breeze from S. E. and squally with rain employed in heaving out, so ends the day

Saturday 15th 1867

Fresh breeze and pleasant by the wind to the Eastward wind from the S. E. Employed in the main rigging spoke the Schr S. W. Phillips of Provincetown Capt. Baylen. Lat 18.48' N Long 28.53' West
