Sunday Nov 26th 1867

Light breeze from the Southward and some rain steering to the N.E. under short sail the S. H. Phillips in sight to leeward and 2 other sails

Lat 18.11 North Long 24.04 West

Monday 17th 1867

Light breeze from S.W. and pleasant steering S.E. all sail set the S. H. Phillips in sight and several other sails in sight Merchantmen

Lat 18.48 North Long 25.05 West

Tuesday 18th 1867

Light breeze from N.W. and fine pleasant weather steering S.E. under all sail saw several sails of Merchantmen spoke and named the S. H. Phillips of Provincetown Lat 18.25 N Long 24.15 W

Wednesday 20th 1867

Light air from the N.W. and fine pleasant steering S.E. by Compass all sail set the S. H. Phillips in sight also several Merchantmen saw the Island of Port St. Antonio was to the Westward

Lat 18.42 N. Long 23.37 W.

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Thursday Nov 20th 1867

Light air inclining to calm at 2 o'clock P. M. took a breeze from N.E. steering S.E. for the Island of Sal which is right ahead. several Merchantmen in sight also the S. H. Phillips

Lat 18.04 N Long 23.17 W

Friday 22nd 1867

Light N.E. wind and fine pleasant weather steering S.E. all sail set in company with the S. H. Phillips passed the Island of Sal about 5 miles distant & sail of merchantmen at anchor

Saturday 23rd 1867

Light breeze from the Eastward and fine pleasant weather steering S.E. by all sail set several sail of Merchantmen in sight the S. H. Phillips out of sight Lat 14.42 N. Long

Sunday 24th 1867

Light breeze from the Eastward and fine pleasant weather steering S.E. by South all sail set saw several sails. Ends the day

Latitude 12 45 North Longitude 20.64 West.
