Light airs from the N.E. and fine pleasant weather
steering S. by E. all sail set saw one sail lowered
for Blackfish without success. Lat 16° 13' N Long 18° 30' W.

Light airs from N.E. and fine pleasant weather steering
S. by E. all sail set nothing in sight.
Latitude 16° 33' N Longitude 18° 34' W.

Wednesday

Wednesday 25th 1867

Light airs from the N.E. and fine pleasant weather
steering S. by E. all sail set saw 2 sails.
Lat 16° 31' N Long 18° 45' W.

Thursday 26th 1867

Light airs from N.E. and fine pleasant weather
steering S. by E. under all sail Broke out
and becketed our raft rask saw one sail.
Lat 16° 18' N Long 18° 47' W.

Friday 27th 1867

Light breeze from N.E. and fine pleasant
weather steering S. by E. under all sail
saw several sails repaired the Skerr Boat
got soundings in 18 fathoms
Lat 15° 57' North Long 18° 48' West

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Saturday Nov 30th 1867

Light airs and calms from N.E. steering
S. by E. saw one sail and the Island
to the Northward and Eastward of us
Lat 14° 42' N Long 14° 16' West

Sunday Dec 1st 1867

Light airs from the Southward and pleasant
steering S. by E. until 11 o'clock P. M. then
then came to anchor in 16 fathoms of water
at daylight took our anchor and sailed
for the Isles of Delos which is in sight
bearing N. by E. distant about 15 miles distant
at 1 o'clock P. M. came to an anchor
the S. H. Phillips to anchor here so ends the day

Monday 2nd 1867

All hands employed in getting of water took
of 2 rafts and stowed one of them Charles
Thompson came near drowning is of duty

Tuesday 3rd 1867

Took of one raft of water send a gang ashore to
cut wood took of one load of wood the S. H.
Admiral Blake came to an anchor Char
Thompson came to duty again
