Wednesday Dec 4th 1867

Employed in getting off water and cutting wood
got off one raft and in boat loads of wood
part of the crew ashore this evening

Thursday 5th 1867

Employed in getting wood aboard finished getting
water Took on board 4 loads of wood
Part of the crew ashore this evening

Friday 6th 1867

All hands employed in getting off and stowing
wood. The Sch. Walter Thwing of Provincetown
came to an anchor so ends the day

Saturday 7th 1867

All hands employed in getting of wood
finished cutting wood one load ashore to be brought off

Sunday 8th 1867

Fine pleasant weather. Part of the crew ashore
and visiting so ends the day

Monday 9th 1867

Took on board 2 loads of wood and stowed it away
repaired the gunnion strap sent down our purchase
and stowed the Port cable and got all ready to
sail.

Tuesday 10th Dec 10th 1867

Light breeze from the Northward and fine pleasant
weather. This A. M. took our anchor in company
with the Sch. G. W. Phillips of Provincetown
and the Admiral Blake of Marion
and stood out through the South passage
saw several fishermen and one Brig

Wednesday 11th 1867

Light breeze from N. W. and pleasant steering
W by compass by painted our Boats saw
Blackfish and one sail

Thursday 12th 1867

Fresh breeze and squally with rain Thunder
and Lightning Middle part pleasant weather
painting the Boats Latter part wind East
with heavy rain

Friday 13th 1867

Light breeze from East and pleasant steering
Thunder short sail employed in painting
