Friday Jan 3rd 1867

Light breeze from N.E. and squally with rain
(thunder and lightning) steering by the wind
on opposite tacks under short sail saw a bark to
windward and haler Lat 05.37 North

Saturday 4th 1867

Baffling winds and pleasant steering different
courses to the westward soke the Schr. W. Irving
of Provincetown saw two other Schooners and
a bark Lat 05.48 N Long 72.20 West

Sunday 5th 1867

Light Baffling winds and squally laying
to gaining the Schooners W. Irving A. Clarence
and M. Remington of Provincetown

Monday 6th 1868

Fresh breeze from the N.E. and pleasant weather
steering by the wind to the Eastward under all
sail, bent the Gaff top sail. split the Flying
jib sent it in for repairs saw several sail of
Merchantmen and the Walter Irving
Lat 05.36 North Long 71.37 West

Tuesday 7th 1868

Fresh breeze and pleasant steering by the wind to the
Northward saw several sails employed in mending
the Flying jib Lat 05.61 North

Wednesday 8th 1868

Light breeze from the N.E. and fine pleasant
weather steering by the wind to the Northward
under easy sail. Finished repairing and bent the
Flying jib saw three sails and exchanged
my slide with an English Bark and agreed
Lat 06.12 North Long 71.35 West

Thursday 9th 1868

Light baffling airs and calms spoke the Schr
A. Clarence Capt. Small of Provincetown came
on board a short time saw another sail to the
W. Lat 06.10 North Long 71.34 West

Friday 10th 1868

Light baffling airs and calms steering to S.E.
by the wind under all sail saw 2 sails

Saturday 11th 1868

Light N.E. wind and pleasant steering by the wind
on opposite tacks under all sail nothing in sight
Lat 06.20 North Long 70.44 West

Sunday 12th 1868

Light airs inclining to calms with some
rain laying to heading to the Northward
Lat 06.11 North
