Monday Jan 13th 1868

Light breeze from N.E. and fine pleasant weather
steering N.W. by compass under all sail saw two
sails steering to the Southward
Lat 06° 10' North Long —

Tuesday 14th 1868

Light breeze from the N.E. and pleasant steering
N.W. by compass under short sail lowered for
Blackfish without success; saw several sails all
Merchantmen; Lat 06° 10' N. Long 24° 37' W.

Wednesday 15th 1868

Light breeze from N.E. and fine pleasant weather
steering N.W. by compass all sail set in sight
Lat 05° 51' North Long 22° 20' West

Thursday 16th 1868

Light breeze from N.E. and fine pleasant weather
steering N.W. by compass under all sail
saw two sails steering S.W. Lat 05° 53' North

Friday 17th 1868

Strong breeze from N.E. and rugged steering
N.W. by compass under all sail lowered for
Blackfish without success; saw several sails
exchanged signals with an English Bark

Saturday Jan 18th 1868

Light breeze and squalls with rain steering by
the wind on opposite tack under short sail
spoke the schooner Admiral Blake of Warren
Boiling saw another schooner did not ascertain
who she was. No Observation.

Sunday 19th 1868

Light breeze from N.E. and pleasant laying
to on the Eastern tack under short sail
saw two schooners Lat 05° 54' N Long 24° 58' W

Monday 20th 1868

Light N.E. wind and hazy weather steering by
the wind on opposite tack under all sail. Saw
two sails steering to the Southward
Lat 06° 55' North Long 24° 53' West

Tuesday 21st 1868

Fresh breeze from the Eastward with rain squalls
and lightning steering by the wind on opposite
tack under short sail lowered for Blackfish
without success

Wednesday 22nd 1868

Light breeze from the Eastward and thick smoky
weather steering by the wind to the S.E. under
easy sail. Nothing in sight
