Sunday March 1st 1868

Fresh trades and rugged, laying by the wind heading to the N. E. under short sail nothing in sight Lat. 10.55 N. Long 38.30 W.

Monday 2nd 1868

Strong trades and rugged steering by the wind to the Northward under easy sail saw a plenty of Embers and 2 sails steering to the N. W. so ends the day Lat. 10.57 North Long 39.01 West

Tuesday 3rd 1868

Strong breeze and rugged steering by the wind to the Northward under easy sail. Lat. 12.18 N Long 39.05 W

Wednesday 4th 1868

Strong trades and pleasant steering by the wind on opposite tacks under all sail saw two Brigs to leeward spoke the Sch. Admiral Blake of Marion Capt. Hammond Lat. — Long 39.25 West

Thursday 5th 1868

Strong trades and pleasant steering by the wind to the Northward under easy sail Lat. 13.00 N Long 39.45 W.

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Friday March 6th 1868

Strong trades and rugged steering by the wind to the N. E. under easy sail saw a whaling Bark pass to leeward of us and also Merchants the Northward. Lat. 13.18 N. Long 39.12 W.

Saturday 7th 1868

Strong trades and rugged steering by the wind on opposite tacks under easy sail saw a Brig steering to the N. W. Lat. 13.01 N Long 38.55 W.

Sunday 8th 1868

Strong breeze and rugged steering by the wind to the Northward under easy sail nothing in sight Lat. 13.28 North Long —

Monday 9th 1868

Strong breeze and rugged laying to under short sail heading to the N. E. nothing in sight Lat. 13.31 N Long unknown

Tuesday 10th 1868

Strong trades and rugged steering by the wind under short sail untill 1 o'clock A. M. then kept off N. N. W. thus ends the day the 10th
