Tuesday Mar 31st 1868

Strong breeze and rugged steering by the wind to the Northward under easy sail, one sail in sight to windward Lat 40° 16' N Long 51° 16' W.

Wednesday April 1st 1868

Strong breeze and squally with some rain by the wind to the Northward saw some breaches but could not ascertain what they were saw one sail to windward Lat 40° 16' N Long unknown

Thursday 2nd 1868

Strong breeze and rugged by the wind on opposite tack, under all sail spoke the schooner S. Lewis of Boston Capt. Smith reported the Sch. C. M. Remington of Provincetown had taken three Whales this day saw a Brig to the S. E. Lat 40° 11' North Long 51° 15' W

Friday 3rd 1868

Strong Breeze and rugged steering by the wind on opposite tack under easy sail, one sail in sight to windward, so ends the day

Saturday 4th 1868

Strong breeze and rugged steering by the wind on opposite tack under easy sail, nothing in sight

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Sunday April 5th 1868

Strong breeze and rugged by the wind on opposite tack under easy sail, nothing in sight

Monday 6th 1868

Strong breeze and rugged with frequent squalls of rain by the wind on opposite tack under short sail, so ends the day

Latitude 40° 32' North Longitude 50° 55' West

Tuesday 7th 1868

Strong breeze and rugged laying to heading to the Northward nothing in sight

Lat 40° 07' North Long 51° 00' West

Wednesday 8th 1868

Strong breeze and rugged steering by the wind under short sail, nothing in sight

Lat 40° 18' North Long 51° 10' West

Thursday 9th 1868

Strong breeze and rugged laying to on opposite tack, saw one sail

Lat 40° 01' North Long 51° 21' West

Friday 10th 1868

Strong breeze and rugged laying to on opposite tack spoke the schooner E. Hoag of Provincetown Emery Master
