Friday July 18th 1868

Fresh breeze and pleasant weather steering by the wind on opposite tacks under all sail saw several sails spoke the Sch^r Octavian Capt Wood reported took a whale on the 12th but owing to bad weather did not save the whale of him Lat 31.01 North Long 30.32 West

Saturday 18th 1868

Fresh breeze from the Eastward and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the S. E. saw braches but did not ascertain what they were one sail in sight Lat 30.45 North

Sunday 19th 1868

Fine pleasant weather laying to heading to the N. W. Nothing in sight this day.

Monday 20th 1868

Light Easterly winds and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the N. E. under all sail gained with the schooner Admiral Blake of Marion Capt Hammond Lat 30.47 North Long 31.31 West

Tuesday July 21st 1868

This day becalmed employed in repairing the fore sail and cleaning the bottom of the Schooner spoke the schooner Admiral Blake and the Aley one of Provincetown, Capt. Brown

Wednesday 22nd 1868

Light breeze from the S. W. and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the Westward under all sail ends the day.

Thursday 23rd 1868

Light breeze from the Southward and fine pleasant weather steering N. E. by compass saw one sail, Lat 31.28 North.

Friday 24th 1868

Light breeze and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind in company with the S. of Jones of Fairhaven, saw another

Saturday 25th 1868

Light airs inclining to calms ^{N. W.} N. W. by compass two sails in sight ends the day

Sunday 26th 1868

Light breeze and fine pleasant weather steering N. W. under all sail saw three sails two Barks and one Schooner Lat 32.47 North Long 32.04 West
