with us Lat 38.07 North Long 62.22 West

Tuesday 28th 1868

Light breeze from N.W. and fine pleasant weather
steering N.W. by compass saw two Barks to windward
spoke the schooner Marcella of Califax 10 days
out bound to Demerara Lat 38.25 N Long 62.37 W

Wednesday 29th 1868

Fresh breeze from W. with cloudy overcast weather
steering by the wind to the N.W. under easy sail
saw two sails steering to the Southward

Thursday 30th 1868

Fresh breeze from the Westward and rugged steering
N.W. under easy sail, saw two sails
Lat 33.54 North Long 63.41 West

Friday 31st 1868

Strong breeze from the westward and rugged
heading by the wind on opposite tack saw two
sails Lat 33.23 North

Saturday Aug 1st 1868

Strong breeze and rugged wind from S.W.
steering to the Westward under easy sail
saw two sails to the Northward scends the day

Sunday 2nd 1868

Strong breeze from the Westward and rugged
heading to the N.W. under easy sail saw
two sails in company with the N. A. Smith
of Boston

Monday 3rd 1868

Light breeze and fine pleasant weather steering
to the S.W. under easy sail two sails in
sight Lat 34.00 North Long 63.30 West

Tuesday 4th 1868

Light breeze and calms steering to the Southward
under all sail bent our new foresail and
stowed our old one below picked up one barrel
of Petroleum one sail in sight
Lat 34.26 North Long 63.23 West

Wednesday 5th 1868

First part light breeze and calms with rain
Thunder and lightning, mid and latter
part fine pleasant weather with a light breeze
came with the Schooners Oppress of Mason
Edith May of Wellfleet W. Irving and
Alyson of Georgetown at ends the day
