Thursday Aug 6th 1868

Light breeze and fine pleasant weather steering to the westward hauled with the water Towing

Friday 7th 1868

Light air and fine pleasant weather steering to the westward under all sail hauled with the Schs Edith May of Wellfleet

Saturday 8th 1868

Light air and calm working to the Westward under all sail the Edith May in sight to Windward

Sunday 9th 1868

Light air and calm laying to heading to the N. W. in company with the Edith May to other in sight

Monday 10th 1868

Light air and fine pleasant weather heading to the N. W. in sight

Tuesday 11th 1868

Light air and calm heading to the S. W. spoke and went on board of the Ship Mullah of London 10 days from Boston bound to Hong Kong. three other sails in sight

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Wednesday 12th 1868

Light breeze from S. E. and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the Eastward under all sail saw several sails

Thursday 13th 1868

Light breeze from the Eastward and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the N. E. under all sail, nothing in sight
Lat 33.14 North Long 53.38 West

Friday 14th 1868

During this day light breeze from S. E. and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the Southward under all sail spoke the Schs Sarah O. Lewis of Boston Capt. Smith 9 months out 110 barrels of sperm, so ends this day

Saturday 15th 1868

Fine pleasant weather by the wind on opposite tacks under all sail spoke the Schs Walter Irving of Provincetown Capt. Atkins & saw another sail

Sunday 16th 1868

Fresh breeze from S. E. and squally with some rain laying to under short sail heading to the Southward, saw one sail
