Saturday February 5th 1876

All these 24 hours fresh breezes from E, S, E men employed in ships duties so ends these 24 hours Lat 21-30 Long 63-45

Sunday February 6th 1876

All these 24 hours fresh E, S, E winds so ends these 24 hours Made Portance at 10 A.M.

Monday February 7th 1876

All these 24 hours fresh trade winds at noon Lashed bore North-East 3 miles men employed in the ships duties so ends this day

Tuesday February 8th 1876

First part of these 24 hours squally and moderate latter part clear with a gentle breeze men employed in ships duties so ends these 24 hours Lat 17-52 Long.

Wednesday February 9th 1876

All these 24 hours gentle breezes from the East at noon made atavilla so ends this day

Thursday February 10th 1876

First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the East latter part moderate at 5 P.M. came to anchor in same bay men employed in the ships duties so ends this day

Friday February 11th 1876

All this day moderate got underweigh and cruise east till evening and went in to anchor at Grand gavic so ends this day

Saturday February 12th 1876

All these 24 hours Calm men employed unloading and bundling sails so ends these 24 hours

Sunday February 13th 1876

All this day pleasant - trying to anchor so ends this day

Monday February 14th 1876

All these 24 hours moderate at 7 P.M. tried for a humpback but did not get fast so ends this day

Tuesday February 15th 1876

All these 24 hours moderate at daylight made sail at 10 A.M. tried for blackfish got 2 at sun down came to anchor so ends this day

Wednesday February 16th 1876

All these 24 hours moderate breezes at daylight got under weigh to cruise at sun down came to anchor so ends this day

Thursday February 17th 1876

All these 24 hours moderate and calm at daylight got under weigh to cruise at 5 P.M. came to anchor so ends this day

Friday February 18th 1876

All these 24 hours Calm men employed on the rigging so ends this day

Saturday February 19th 1876

First part of these 24 hours fresh trade winds at 5 A.M. got anchor to cruise so ends this day

Sunday February 20th 1876

All these 24 hours moderate breezes at 7 P.M. came to anchor in the bay of Del, town so ends this day

Monday Feb^y 21st 1876

All these 24 hours moderate at 5 P.M. got under weigh to cruise so ends this day
