

Journal of a Whaling Voyage aboard

Thursday March 9th 1876
All these 24 hours moderate at 5 P.M. came to anchor at daylight got under weigh to cruise so ends these 24 hours

Friday March 10th 1876
All these 24 hours moderate at 8 P.M. came to anchor at 6 A.M. got under weigh to cruise Calm, came to anchor at 10 A.M. men employed in ship's duties so ends these 24 hours

Saturday March 11th 1876
All these 24 hours calm at daylight got under weigh to cruise did not get off of bowsprings so ends these 24 hours

Sunday March 12th 1876
All these 24 hours Calm and moderate at 7-30 P.M. got the boats ahead to keep the vessel from drifting on to the cliffs so end these 24 hours with a moderate breeze from N.W. by N. course west by south.

Monday March 13th 1876
All these 24 hours gentle breezes from the East at 11 A.M. made the Island of St. Bache bearing N.W. by W. so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday March 14th 1876
all these 24 hours moderate at sundown Sand bay bore North - took in sail and laid through the night at daylight made sail to cruise so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday March 15th 1876
All these 24 hours moderate and calm at 5 P.M. came to anchor in the bay of Sibarouen at 7 P.M. got under weigh and ship off for Jamaica at 8 A.M. saw a Island bore North dist 12 miles at midnight ^{clock} cord away the band on the fore cover that the fore sheet ^{block} travel on so ends these 24 hours

Thursday March 16th 1876
All these 24 hours fresh breezes from the East at sundown made the East end of Jamaica at 8 P.M. made Morant point light bearing west by south at 9 A.M. Portland point bore North dist 10^{mi} so ends this day

Friday March 17th 1876
All these 24 hours moderate breeze at sundown took in the mainsail and set the topsail and lay for the night at 10 P.M. busted the foresail at 5 A.M. unhooked the old foresail and bent the new foresail at 10 A.M. came to anchor so ends these 24 hours

Saturday March 18th 1876
All these 24 hours on moderate men employed mending the mainsail and cutting wood so ends these 24 hours

Sunday March 19th 1876
All these 24 hours gentle breezes from the west men on shore on liberty. the following deserted, Richard E. Jones - David E. Jones - John Donohew - Dennis Ford - Timothy Murray so ends this day

Monday March 20th 1876
All these 24 hours gentle breezes from the west so ends this day

Tuesday March 21st 1876
All these 24 moderate - William Welch and David Curtis Deserted. Men employed painting the vessel. so ends this day

Wednesday March 22nd 1876
This day fresh breezes from the north west shipped 6 Dit men so ends this day
