Provincetown December the 5th 1876

at 10 am got under way from Provincetown
wind NNE and light at 3 P.M. Passed the
race at 5 1/2 P.M. Passed the high land light

6 This day begins with a light breeze wind NNE
on bent the Churns on Stowed them below

7 This day begins with a light breeze middle
fresh look in gaff top sail and Staysail
at 2 P.M. Set the gaff top sail less wind
with rain

8 This day begins with a strong breeze and
rain at 6 am took in the mainsail and
Set the trisail fresh breeze from SW lat 37 1/10
lon 63-16

9 This day begins with a gale from SSW
Schooner how to under trisail carried away
the after davit of the larboard Boat and
the Port davit of the Stern Boat at 4 P.M.
Set a close reefed foresail and bob jib

10 This day begins with a gale from the NW
at 4 1/2 am a Sea Struck the Starboard
Boat and parted one gripe and carried
away the after davit at 2 pm kept off SE
at 4 pm took the larboard Boat on deck
at 11 P.M. carried away the forward davit
of the waist Boat wind NW

11 This day begins with a light breeze but ruff
at 8 am took the Starboard Boat on deck
at 4 P.M. took in the foresail. Glating had
at 8 P.M. it light breeze from the SW lat
35-44 lon 57-25
