

- 9 Sunday begins with a fresh breeze and smoky weather and continues through the day wind SW Saw Ship bound N lat 31-54 lon 76-29
- 10 This day begins with a fresh breeze at 3 pm double reefed the fore sail at 3 1/2 pm took in the foresail for a heavy squall broke the bolt that the fore peak halyards hooked in to at 4 pm let the fore sail wind SW lat 32-29
- 11 This day begins with rain middle and latter part fine Saw Porpoises lat 32-27 lon 74 wind NW
- 12 This day begins with a light breeze and continues through the day Saw a Stomach 1 Schooner and a Bark Saw Grampuses and Porpo caught a turtle lat 32-38 lon 74-22
- 13 This day begins with a moderate breeze and fine weather middle and latter part rain Spoke a schooner from Portland Bound to Cuba
- 14 This day begins with a moderate breeze from the NE middle and latter part fresh lat 34-03 lon 71-22
- 15 This day begins with a fresh breeze and continues through the day at 10 am came up out to the north of the Stream at 1 pm found 26 fathoms of water Saw Blackfish and a finback

- 16 Sunday begins with a light breeze from the NE middle and latter part light breeze from the SE Spoke a Schooner from New Orleans bound to New York lat 36 lon 73-42
- 17 This day begins with a light breeze middle and latter part fresh breeze from the SW lat 36-21 lon 72-30
- 18 This day begins with a moderate breeze and continues through the day Saw a finback Saw 2 Sail wind S lat 39-05 latter part rain
- 19 This day begins with thick fog and continues through the day wind from NW to NE
- 20 This day begins with fine weather and moderate Saw 2 New York Pilot Boats lat 40-40 lon 70-55 Painted the vessel in tide at 10 pm Saw Gay head light
- 21 This day begins with fine weather and moderate at 8 am passed Gay head light at 3 pm passed the Cross rip light Boat at 6 pm Passed the harbor Chief light Boat at 8 pm Passed the Pollock rip
- 22 This day begins with fine weather and moderate at 1 am Passed the Cross rip at 7 am Passed the highland light at 8 pm Passed the light at 11-15 am anchor in Provincetown Harbor
