

Remarks on Board Schooner E. H. Hatfield

Thursday July th 1 1880

This day begins with a fresh breeze from S W with good weather at 5 P.M. tack Ship heading S by E. Middle part fresh breeze from S W heading S by E.

at 1/2 past 11 A.M. spoke the Schooner Emma Jane of Edgartown 9 months out with 425 bbls of oil.

Friday July th 2 Lat 30° 08' N Long 74° 37' W

This day begins with a light breeze from S W with fine weather heading S by E. in company with the Emma Jane Middle & last part fine breeze from S W heading S by E. at 11 A.M. tacked Ship heading W by N Saw black fish the Emma Jane in sight

Lat 31° 34' N Long 74° 11' W

Saturday July 3

This day begins with a fine breeze from S W with good weather steering a long by the wind heading S S W Saw porpoises One sail in sight the watch employed in fitting the cutting gear Middle & last part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from S W heading S by E. the watch employed in breaking out for water and beef

Lat 30° 45' N Long 73° 59' W

Emma Jane

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Sunday July 4 1880

These 24 hours commences with a fresh breeze from S W heading S by E. the watch variously employed. at Sunset Shortened Sail. Middle & last part Squally heading W by N

Lat 30° 21' N Long 73° 30' W

Monday July th 5

This day begins with a light breeze from S W by W heading South at 5 P.M. wore Ship heading N W by W Middle & last part light variable breezes with squalls of rain steering W by N two sails in sight

Lat 30° 01' N Long 74° 29' W

Tuesday July 6

This day begins with a light breeze from S S E fine weather steering W by N the watch variously employed Two sails in sight Middle & last part light variable breezes with fine weather

at 6 A.M. spoke the Schooner Gracie M. Parker Province town

Lat 30° 01' N Long 74° 40' W

Wednesday July 7

This day begins with a light breeze from S W heading W by N at 3 P.M. Saw black fish toward the boats for them at 5 came on board black fish out of sight
