Middle & last part light wind from SW
with good weather under short sail
the watch variously employed at 9 A.M.
Spoke the Schooner Lottie & Cook
Province town 5 Months out with
20 bbls of oil at 12 past 11 A.M.
Spoke the Schooner William Marlin
of Boston 6 Months out with 20 bbls
of sperm

Thursday July 7th 1880

This day begins with a fine breeze
from SW. Steering various courses
at 6 P.M. Spoke the Schooner Rising
Sun Taylor Master 6 Months out
50 bbl of whale 30 sperm

from SW with pleasant weather
steering by the wind at 6 P.M. Spoke

in setting up rigging

Agate and Ellen Rippah of Province
town
