Wednesday July 14 1880

This day begins with a light breeze from W steering by the wind at 2 P.M. Saw Black fish going quick one Schooner and a Bark in sight Middle & last part light breeze from WNW steering by the wind three sails in sight

Thursday July 15

This day begins with a light wind from W.S.W. with fine weather heading by the wind N.W. by W at 4 P.M. Spoke the Schooner Surprise of New Bedford Middle & last part light wind from W steering by the wind two sails in sight

Lat 30° 14' N
Long 74° 03' W

Friday July 16

This day begins with a fine breeze from W and fine weather two sails in sight the watch variously employed in ships duty Middle & last part light wind from W by S. with cloudy weather steering by the wind the watch variously employed

Lat 31° 00' N
Long 74° 32' W

Schooner Surprise

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Saturday July 17 1880

This day begins with a fresh wind from W by S. steering by the wind heading N.W. Tonic sail in sight Middle & last part fresh wind from WSW with a heavy sea on heading a long by the wind under short sail.

Long 74° 38' W

Sunday July 18

This day begins with a fresh wind from WSW with a heavy sea on heading a long N.W. under short sail Middle & last part squally with thunder and lightning heavy squalls of rain

Lat 32° 10' N
Long 76° 20' W

Monday July 19

These 24 hours begins with heavy squalls of rain with thunder and lightning wind all round the compass Middle & last part fresh breeze with cloudy weather wind SSW steering by the wind 3 sails in sight

Lat 31° 07' N
Long 75° 35' W

Tuesday July 20

This day begins with a fresh breeze from SSW steering by the wind at 6 P.M. Spoke a Ferris Bark. Bound to Wilmington & put letters on board of her
